- 7 **Cultural discourse courses may also be used to satisfy any other requirement.**

Up to 51 credits in English can be applied to the degree; at least 21 credits must be in literature. A grade of C or higher is required for a course to be counted in the major. For residency, a student must have at least 12 hours in 300- or 400-level English classes from Texas A&M University.

College and University Requirements

Other courses may qualify for the following categories. All courses are to be selected with the approval of the student's academic advisor. The courses incorporate [University Core Curriculum](#) requirements. No course can be counted in more than one category, except as allowed in the minor field of study and the [International and Cultural Diversity, and Cultural Discourse graduation requirements](#). ~~requirement~~-A minimum of 36 hours of 300- or 400-level coursework must be completed at Texas A&M University, with at least 12 of those hours being in the major.

Minor Field of Study

English majors are advised, but not required, to select a minor field of study. Students who elect to complete a minor should contact the department or program that offers the minor to determine the requirements for that minor. A grade of C or higher is required for a course to be counted in the minor field. A minor field must be declared before the student has completed 75 credit hours.
