Angel Mario Carrizales (carri1214) (10/08/18 9:04 am): Rollback: Please address the following: 1) MATH 140 is marked out on the degree evaluation but is listed in the Catalog. 2) Only 3 hours of "Directed Non-AGEC Electives" are listed in the catalog, the degree evaluation list 6 hours. Also, there are 12 hours of "Directed AGECElectives" in the plan of study grid; however the evaluation only lists 9hrs. Please make the necessary adjustments to the Plan of study grid.

Angel Mario Carrizales (carri1214) (10/15/18 11:58 am): Rollback: The "Directed AGECElective" and "Directed NON-AGECElective" discrepancy noted in my previous comments has not been addressed.

Angel Mario Carrizales (carri1214) (10/18/18 11:43 am): Rollback: The previous comment has not been addressed. The number of hours for Directed AGECElectives listed in the CATALOG sum to 12. [3 hours in 3rd Yr, Spring term; 6 hours in 4th Yr, Fall term; and 3 hours in 4th Yr, Spring term]; however the evaluation list 9 hours of directed AGECElectives. Also, The Directed NON-AGECElectives listed in the catalog sum to 3 hours [3rd Yr, Fall) yet the evaluation list 6 hours. Are the requirements changing?
